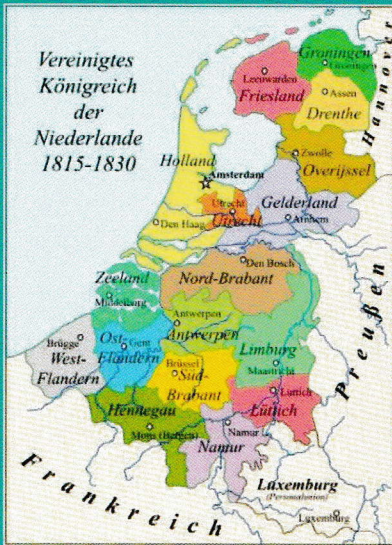

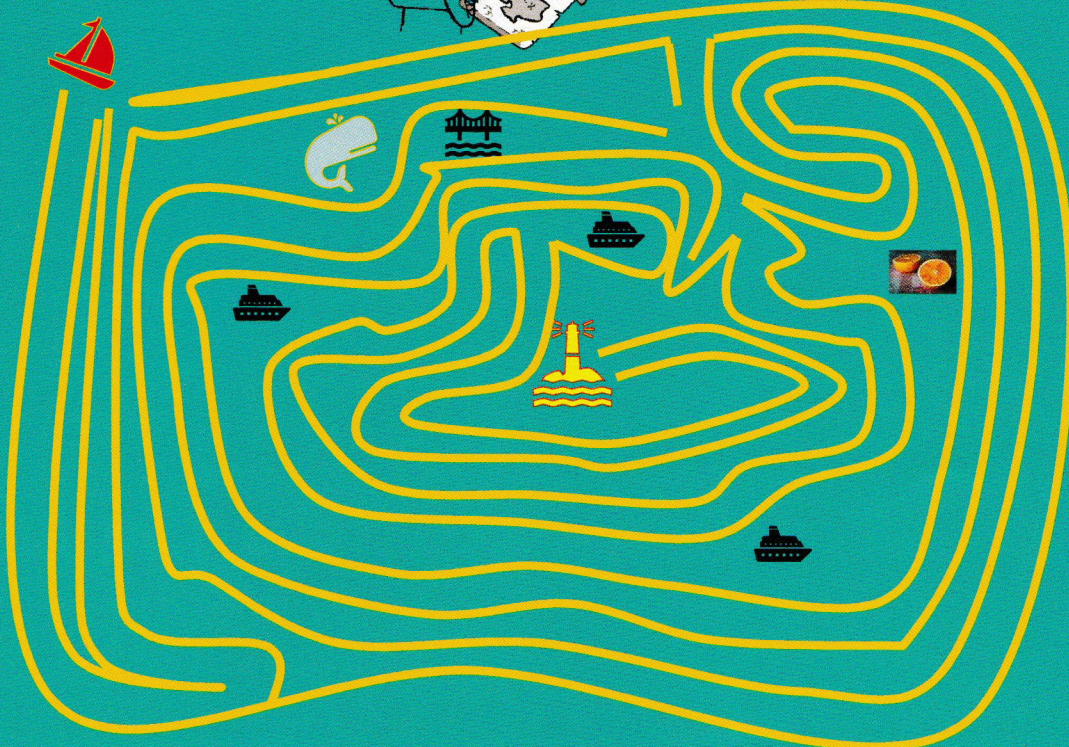

DICK'S NOTEBOOK

LUNDY ISLAND PUFFINS



Lundy Island lies off the north coast of Devon. Lundy means 'Puffin Island' in Norse, the language of the Vikings.

The puffins are a small species of auk. They are a stocky black and white bird with a colourful beak in the breeding season. They shed the colourful outer layer of their beak after breeding. Their short wings are adapted for swimming and when flying through the air they have to beat their wings about 400 times a minute to stay airborne.

Every spring the puffins arrive on Lundy and stay until August. They set up colonies on the cliff top, building nests by burrowing into the shallow earth. They particularly like to use rabbit burrows. They spend the winter at sea far from land.

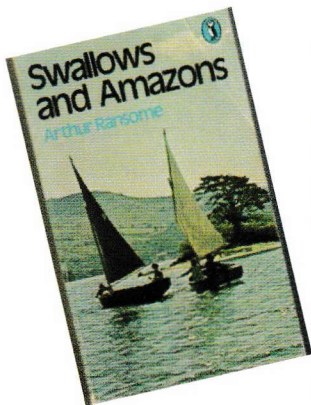

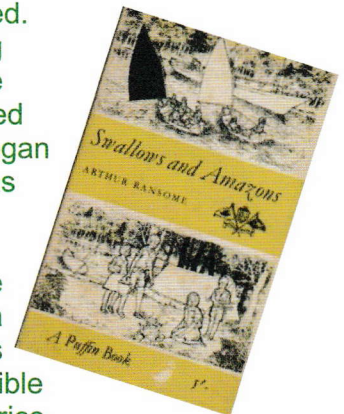
PUFFIN BOOKS

It is almost 75 years since the first Puffin book was published. They were designed to be good-quality books for young readers at an affordable price. Among the first books were titles about the natural world aimed at city children evacuated to the countryside during the war. The Story Book series began in 1941 with the aim of publishing the best of new authors as well as established classics

In the 1960s and 70s they published all twelve titles of the Swallows and Amazons series, with AR's illustrations and a range of interesting cover designs. If you live in the UK it is worth visiting your local charity shops where it is often possible to find these books in good condition and at a reasonable price.
